


Florence Coussoule (1913-2007)

Cheshire — Florence Janet Coussoule, 93 of 36 Richmond died Thursday (July 26, 2007) at home.

Born in Housatonic on Oct. 1, 1913, daughter of L. Frank and Harriet Wolcott Vincent, she moved to Pittsfield (MA) as a child and graduated from Pittsfield High in 1932.

Mrs. Coussoule was a secretary at General Electric Co. for nine years and worked for the Department, of Public Welfore





As the family historian, she kept detailed records and photographs of generations of Vincents. She was a descendant of Adrian Vincent, who crossed the Atlantic three times in the early 1600's, finally setting in New Amsterdam, now New York City, in the mid 1600's and of whom genealogy books have been written.

She and her husband, George C. Coussoule, were married Jan. 18, 1941. They moved to Cheshire in 1947, and he Dec. 19, 1987.

She leaves a son George V. Coussoule, with whom she resided; and a daughter, Marilyn J. Cousoule of Lanesborough.

In lieu of flowers, contributions in memory of Mrs. Coussoule may be made to Berkshire Humane Society.

Mrs. Coussoule also leaves generations of nieces and nephews and her daughter's companion James P. McCauley. She was predeceased by her brothers Merton, Raymond, and Delmar, and by her sisters, Mamie, Jenny and Ethel. She shared decades of memories and enthralled friends and family her entire life with her storytelling. She loved the outdoors and animals, visiting family and friends, and giving gifts to everyone.

Cambridge (IL) — Dorothy F. Vincent, 94, of Cambridge, died Thursday, Feb. 19, 2009, at Hillcrest Home, rural Geneseo.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 26, at the Cambridge Chapel of Stackhouse-Moore Funeral Services. The Rev. John Vincent will officiate and burial will be in Rosedale Cemetery, Cambridge. Visitation will be from 1-2 p.m. Thursday at the funeral home. Memorials may be made to Feed the Children of Oklahoma City.

She was born in rural Osco on Sept. 5, 1914, the daughter of John C. and Florence (Elm) Nye. She was educated in Osco Elementary School and Cambridge High School, graduating in 1931. She married Sam M. Vincent on Dec. 3, 1934, in Cambridge, and they celebrated 57 years of marriage. He predeceased her in death on June 24, 1992.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Art (Eleanor) Rutherford of Frederick, Md; a son, the Rev. John M. and Joan Vincent of Oklahoma City; grandchildren John D. and Melissa Vincent of Oklahoma City, Ann-Louise Rutherford of Frederick, Md. And Mellissa and Jason Bush of Alpine, Calif.; a great-grandchild, Rebecca Ege of Frederick, Md.; a brother, Ray Nye of Hempbill, Texas. Her parents preceded her in death.

She and her husband farmed for 40 years in Cambridge, Annawan and Orion, retiring in 1973 and then moving to Cambridge in 1977. Her memberships included Beulah Presbyterian Church of Orion, First Baptist Church of Cambridge, the Rock Island County Home Bureau and the Rock Island County and Henry County Farm Bureaus. Dorothy enjoyed dancing, Big Band music, gardening, canning, and reading. She especially enjoyed spending time with and caring for her family.

First Three Generation Descendants of Thomas William Vincent (VF# 561) Of Albany and Tioga Counties, New York

(carrying forward the families with Vincent surname)

1. Thomas William Vincent, son of Levi and Eflanner (Kniffen) Vincent was born on 12 May 1811 at Albany Co., NY. He married Abigail (Abbie) Jane Rockwell. Thomas William Vincent and wife Abigail died after 7 July 1880 when they were recorded in the census.

On 9 September 1848 Thomas W. Vincent was named as a son in the will of Levi Vincent of Coeymans, Albany County, NY. Thomas W. Vincent was mentioned in his sister, Olive Vincent's, will, recorded 1 November 1871. In the will of his sister, Phebe Vincent, she mentioned Thomas W. Vincent's daughters, Sarah A. Elliott and Phebe J. Vincent on 3 October 1872. Thomas William (as T. W.) Vincent was enumerated in the 1850 census for the Town of Tioga (Tioga Center Post Office). In the 1880 census Thos. W. Vincent, wife Abigal J. and their son Calvin with his young family still resided in the Town of Tioga. In the 1855 New York Census for Tioga County, Thomas W. Vincent and family resided in Tioga Town. He was age 43, a stone mason, born in Albany County. His wife "Abba" was born in Greene County. They had lived in the town for 15 years.

Abigail (Abbie) Jane Rockwell was born circa 1812 given her age of 43 in the 1855 Tioga Co. Census. In the 1855 census she was named Abigail Vincent, in the 1850 census the name appears to be Ann Eliza Vincent. Children of Thomas William Vincent and Abigail Jane Rockwell:

- + 2 i. Sarah Abigail2 Vincent was born on 21 Feb 1834. She married (1)
 James U. Aldridge at Trumansburg, NY. She married (2) Rev.
 Oscar Elliott.

I, 109th New York Volunteers on 8 August 1862. He was promoted to corporal. He was wounded in action 12 May 1864 at Spotsylvania Court House, Virginia and died 15 May 1864. Prior to the war he studied for the ministry.
- + 6 v. Calvin Ladowick Vincent was born on 26 Jul 1848 at Town of Barton, Tioga Co., NY. He married Helen Perry.
 - 7 vi. Thomas Vincent was born circa Aug 1850; died 4 Apr 1854.
 - 8 vii. John Vincent, died young.

2. Sarah Abigail2 Vincent (Thomas I) was born on 21 Feb 1834. She married (1) James U. Aldridge at Trumansburg, NY. She married (2) Rev. Oscar Elliott; He was mentioned to be from Rome, PA in the Thomas W. Vincent biography. She died between 1929 and 1930.

James U. and Sarah Abigail (Vincent) Aldridge are buried at Smithboro Cemetery, Smithboro, Tioga Co., NY. James U. Aldridge died circa 1853. He died in 1861 at Trumansburg, Tompkins Co., NY; His death was recorded on a Passport application by his son Vincent in 1918.

- + 9 i. Vincent3 Aldridge was born on 5 Sep 1857 at
 Trumansburg, Tomkins Co., NY. He married (?) __. He
 married Belle Voorhees in 1887 at Manhattan, NY. He

- 4. Phoebe Jane2 Vincent (Thomas *I*) was born on 25 Mar 1840 at Nichols, Tioga Co., NY. She married Andrew Jackson Towner on 13 Sep 1863. She died on 9 Feb 1910 at Lestershire, Broome Co., NY, at age 69; Phoebe Jane and Andrew Jackson Towner are buried at Smithboro Cemetery, Smithboro, Tioga Co., NY.

Andrew Jackson Towner was born on 2 Jul 1834 at Nichols, Tioga Co., NY. He died on 7 Feb 1898 at Center Valley, PA, at age 63. Ruth Nichols has

obtained military records for Andrew Jackson Towner. He enlisted May 16, 1861 at Owego, Tioga Co., NY to serve two years with company C of the 23rd Regiment, New York Infantry. Born in Tioga County, he was described as 22 years of age, 5ft 5in in height with gray eyes and brown hair, a musician. He was discharged 22 May 1863 in Elmira, NY. Andrew Jackson Towner was known by the name Jack. He was a fifer in the Civil War serving in Company C, 23rd Regiment, New York Infantry. His great-grandaughter, Ruth Nichols recalls the family legend told by her mother that he could whistle in a way that sounded just like his fife. In the 1870 United States Census Jackson, age 35, and Phebe J., age 30, Towner resided with Gersham, age 82, and Sarah, age 76, Towner in Rome Borough, Bradford Co., PA. Shortly after the death of her husband, Phoebe J. Towner applied for a widows pension (application number 671276). Andrew Jackson and Phoebe Jane (Vincent) Towner are buried in Smithboro Cemetery, Smithboro, Tioga Co., NY.

- 13 iv. Sally Jane Towner was born on 13 Jun 1877. She died on 25 Jun 1877.
- 14 v. Clyde Vincent Towner was born on 23 Aug 1878 at Nichols, Tioga Co., NY. He married Myrtie Lena Eckert in 1900 at Smithboro, Tioga Co., NY. He died on 13 Jul 1960 at Binghamton, Broome Co., NY, at age 81.

15 vi. Alice Jane Towner was born on 2 Sep 1881 at Tioga Co., NY. She married Lewis Oliver Stewart on 24 Jul 1901. She died on 19 Jan 1973 at age 91.

Calvin Ladowick2 Vincent (Thomas 1) was born on 26 Jul 1848 at Town of Barton, Tioga Co., NY. He married Helen Perry, daughter of Chauncey Perry, on 4 Jul 1868 according to his pension application. He married (2nd) Viola A. Tilbury, daughter of William Tilbury and Esther Hemstraught, on 8 Apr 1871 at Union, Broome Co., NY, by Ambrose Truesdale, according to the April 14, 1871 issue of Union News (Tioga Co., NY) and his pension application. He died on 8 Feb 1938 at Elmira, Chemung Co., NY, aged 89 years, 6 months, and 12 days.

Calvin L. Vincent spent most of his life in Tioga

County. Was a Justice of The Peace. In the Civil War, Calvin L. Vincent was drafted and mustered on the 15 July 1863 at Oswego, NY. He was assigned to Company I, 109th New York Volunteers. In June 1864 he became ill and was hospitalized in several hospitals, finally at Your Hospital, Pennsylvania, and as he reported in his pension application "my father came after me and took me home remained at home 30 days." At the close of the War he had been transferred to Co. A, 22d Veteran Reserve Corps and was training new troops at City Point, Va. He was serving on guard duty in Washington, DC when President Lincoln was assassinated. He served at Cincinnati as a mustering-out clerk in the Army. He was discharged 4 August 1865 at Cincinnati, OH. He applied for a pension (# C-2574-460) on 5 June 1926 at age 78 years. He was living with his son, Truman Vincent. He was described as standing 5 ft. 8 1/2 inches, dark complexion, black eyes, and brown hair, a farmer, when he enlisted. He reported that since the service he had lived in Barton, NY and Elmira, NY. His occupation had been "mostly mail carrier." He was the Commander of Baldwin Post of the Grand Army of the Republic for 6 to 10 years. In 1931/32, he served as State Commander of the GAR. He also served in the position of State Inspector and was a member of the National Board Council.

He belonged to Ivy Lodge, F. & A. M. and was awarded a 50-year medal in 1937. He was a Past Grand Noble of IOOF and Masonic Past Master. The family was living in the Town of Tioga, Tioga Co., NY during the 1900 census. An obituary was published 9 February 1939 in Elmira's *Star Gazette Newspaper*.

Calvin L. Vincent, 90, of 402 Welles St., died unexpectedly at 4:30 pm Tuesday, Feb. 8, 1939, at the home. He was commander of Baldwin Post, 6, GAR past state commander of the GAR, member of the National Board of Counsel, GAR; state inspector of the GAR; member of the First M. E. Church; Ivy Lodge 397, F&AM, which awarded him a 50-year Masonic medal in 1937; Smithboro, NY, Lodge, IOOF, and he was a Masonic past master.

He is survived by two sons, Charles Vincent of Hornell and Truman Vincent of Elmira, eight grandchildren and two greatgrandchildren. The body is in the Holly funeral home and will be removed to the family home late Wednesday afternoon. A private prayer service in the family home Friday, 1:30 pm. Funeral

Services under the auspices of Baldwin Post 6, GAR at 2pm in the First M. E. Church. Rev. John N. Willis. Burial in the Barton Cemetery, a firing squad from Co, L, assisting. Helen Perry died on 19 Apr 1869 at Barton, Tioga Co., NY.

He died on 24 Dec 1932 at Smithboro, Tioga Co., NY, at age 63; George C. and Sarah J. Vincent are buried at Smithboro Cemetery, Smithboro, Tioga Co., NY. During the 1900 census the family lived in the Town of Tioga, Tioga Co., NY. Sarah Jane White was born in Oct 1871 at Tioga Co., NY. She died in 1962.

Children of George Caty3 Vincent and Sarah Jane White:

- i. Edward Lewis Vincent was born on 17 May 1898 at Barton, Tioga Co., NY. He married (1st) Irene Virginia Ostrander (--?--) on 7 Mar 1918 at Horseheads, Chemung Co., NY. He married Myrtle Marie Wilcox circa 1936. He died on 15 Dec 1982 at Vestal, Broome Co., NY, at age 84. He was buried at Smithboro Cemetery, Smithboro, Tioga Co., NY.
- 17. Charles William3 Vincent (Calvin2, Thomas1) was born on 5 Aug 1875. He married (1st) Nellie Mallory, daughter of Charles Mallory, circa 1899. He married (2nd) Nellie Stitziel Farnum on 23 Dec 1915 at Hornell, Steuben Co.,, NY. He married (3rd) Ethel M. Tilbury circa 1921.

In the 1900 census, Charles and Nellie Vincent were recorded to have been married one year; they resided with Charles and Eliza J. Mallory in the Town of Barton, Tioga Co., NY. His was age 24 and his occupation was telegrapher. In 1910, the family was still living in Barton, his 62 year old father-in-law Charles Mallory lived with the family; Charles W. Vincent was a railroad telegrapher and their son Grey M. Vincent was aged 9. When Charles William Vincent recorded his Registration Card during World War II on 12 Sept 1918 he resided at 4 park St., Hornell, Steuben Co., NY. He was age 42 with occupation of telegraph operator for the ERR (Erie Railroad), working in Hornell. He named his wife Nellie Farnum Vincent as his closest relative. In 1920, Charles Vincent resided in Hornell, Steuben Co., NY, a widower and occupation telegrapher. His son Grey Vincent lived with him, age 18, he was a druggist at a "long store." In the 1930 census Charles W. Vincent, age 52 lived in the 5th Ward of Hornell, NY. Included in the family were Ethel M. Vincent, age 28, and children Alice V., age 8, Bernice A., age 6, Donald C., age 5, and Raymond C?, age 3.

Nellie Mallory was born in Nov 1878 at Pennsylvania. She died before 1915. Children of Charles William3 Vincent and Nellie Mallory: + 22 i. Grey Mallory4 Vincent was born in 1901 at New York. He

married Helen (--?--).

Nellie Stitziel Farnum was born circa 1887. She died in 1919; She is buried at the Rural Cemetery, Hornell, NY as Nellie F. Vincent, 1887 - 1919.

Ethel M. Tilbury was born circa 1902 at New York. She died after 22 October 1988, the date of her son Donald's death. She may be the Ethel M.
